Copenhagen

Copenhagen airport is the primary hub for airport travel and is the closet to the city centre making it the best to fly into when visiting Copenhagen, Denmark. It is connected to the city centre by fast Danish Railways (DSB) trains and Copenhagen Metro (M2) subway lines. Trains take 13 minutes to the city centre while subway takes 15 minutes, buses on the other hand make the journey in about 22 minutes.

The airport is served by major airlines such as Air Canada, Air Asia, Air India, Emirates, Air China, Air Canada, Air Cairo, Air Greenland, Air France, Air Switzerland, Thai Airways, Ukraine Airways, and many other airlines with domestic and international flights across the world. This airport handles more passengers than Roskilde airport meaning you will experience more crowd, queues at security/immigration and some flight delays. Copenhagen airport has more facilities to make you enjoy your trip while at the airport and from this airport, it is easy to see top attractions in the city centre such as Tivoli Gardens (19th century amusement park), Slotsholmen (52-acre island and center of government), The Little Mermaid, Nyhavn, Freetown Christiania, and many other places of interest.
